KEY PROGRAMS



Read & Write + Code is an expansion of ReadNYC, our decade-long literacy program in the Bronx. RWC continues to address children's foundational literacy and wellness needs, while investing in their 21st century needs to integrate reading and writing, engaging with culturally responsive teaching, and introducing computer science into the humanities.

Our Books from Birth program focuses on increasing opportunities for children to experience literacy-rich environments at home, in school, and throughout their communities. Books from Birth sends books directly to families, while collaborating with community partners to build libraries in accessible and convenient spaces.





UWNYC is a proud member of the Education Equity Action Plan Coalition, helping NYC schools officials implement a Black Studies curriculum. UWNYC hosted 30+ community events to build public support for Black Studies, including a bookmobile rolling up across the city to share culturally responsive resources with families.
